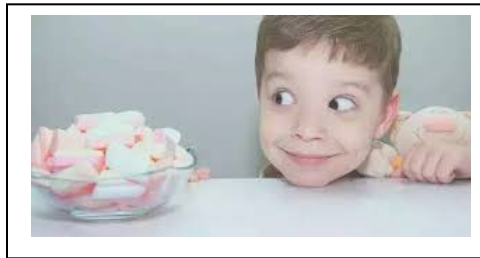
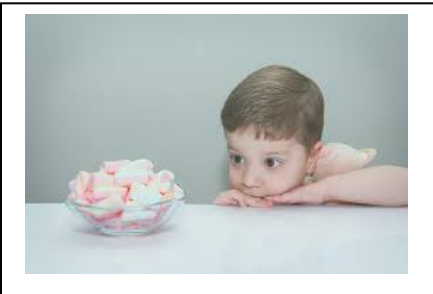


Patience: pa·tience /'pāSHəns/

- Being able to accept delay, trouble, or suffering without getting angry or upset.
- It is persevering toward a goal, enduring trials or expectantly waiting for a promise to be fulfilled.
- Accept difficulties without giving God deadlines.
- Accepting what the Lord gives on His timetable – or what He chooses not to give.
- Sentences:
 - I don't have patience to wait in line for hours just to buy a ticket.
 - Patience can mean not giving up and yielding under pressure.

T – tranquil

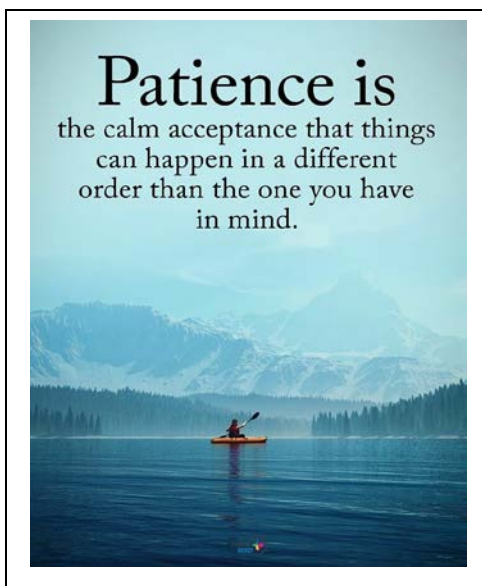
I – injuring none
